5. Delegation

Mayor Tom Peckett, McNab/Braeside was in attendance to provide information on the Sustain initiative that the Township of McNab/Braeside is working on.

Mayor Peckett presented a video summarizing the project.

Mayor Peckett reviewed the initiative thus far.

Committee had questions surrounding the project.

Councillor Hall wondered on the timeline. Mayor Peckett responded that Sustain is prepared to begin construction shortly and will work to ensure it has enough garbage for the process. He added that Sustain is leasing property from McNab/Braeside within their landfill property.

Mayor Donohue wondered if 200 tonne of waste was the smallest of the buildings? Mayor Peckett answered yes, but this plant will be built with expansion in mind and will be able to accommodate more waste should the need arise.

Mayor Donohue stated that there is no financial commitment required, just a Memorandum of Understanding to be signed indicating that your waste will be redirected to Sustain. Mayor Peckett replied yes, and that Sustain is also in talks with the City of Ottawa as the amount of waste to be generated in Renfrew and Lanark counties may still not be enough.

Mayor Peckett also indicated that Sustain will mine township landfills. This will be an initiative that could save many rural landfills from being closed. He added that the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks has made it clear that no more landfill expansions will be granted in Ontario.

Mayor Donohue thanked Mayor Peckett for the presentation on the Sustain initiative.

Mayor Peckett left the meeting at 7:06 p.m.

6. Waste Management By-Law Amendments Report

a) Draft Waste Management By-Law

Committee discussed the revised Draft Waste Management By-Law. Discussions were had on the proposed time changes for the transfer stations and the landfill. Concerns were again raised on the cost of the bag tags, large families and not instituting clear bags.

CAO/Charkavi noted that By-Law Enforcement had finished their review of the draft by-law and that will be shared with Committee.

Committee did not have enough time to give the draft by-law the attention it requires and as such deferred it to the next Committee meeting.
