6. 2004 Volvo Grader – 2023-02-03

Public Works Superintendent Visinski reviewed the report concerning the 2004 Volvo Grader. A new grader will not be available for at least a year delivery date. There are used graders available, however, it is very important to ensure that the Township is purchasing a grader with a certain amount of hours on it.

Discussion was had on leasing and renting a grader once it is required. Public Works Superintendent stated that in the Joint Roads Review it was suggested that municipalities share such equipment, however, he stated that when we require a grader so do our neighbours. He did add that we would be able to rent in certain circumstances and can still use the grader that is at the Bromley garage if needed.

Committee discussed how much should be spent on fixing the grader and could the Township use the grader if we fixed it. Public Works Superintendent Visinski replied that if the grader was fixed at minimum, that amount is just to be able to move the grader to sell and could not be trusted to run. He also stated that if Committee chooses the more expensive fix, it may come with a warranty, but the rest of the machine is still old and any one of those parts could fail, causing the grader to again not run, thus costing more money.

Re: Speed Reduction Request

#### **Background:**

The Operations Committee received a request to reduce the speed limit on Lynch and Colton Roads from Brady Neill who lives on one of the roads. They are concerned with safety of children playing and the speed of the vehicular traffic. Attached is a letter from Mr. Neill.

Note: Mr. Neill has requested to attend the meeting if Committee has any questions.

#### Discussion:

Staff set up the traffic counters which also collect the speed of traffic and this was the resultant information. The average daily traffic count (DTC) on Lynch road was 36 vehicles per day and an average speed of 57km/h. The DTC for Colton road was 59 vehicles per day and an average speed of 60km/h. Staff will reinstall the traffic counters to monitor during the summer months as there maybe increased traffic due to this area having many seasonal visitors to cottages on two local lakes.

Staff reached out to the Renfrew Detachment OPP for any reports on those roads:

In 2022 there was:

- one motor vehicle collision which was a vehicle vs a deer.
- one speeding ticket wrote.

In 2023 there are neither any motor vehicle collisions nor tickets wrote. (March 25 2023)

Staff would consider putting in place hidden intersection signs and children playing signs to help with hidden driveways.

The Township is primarily 80 km throughout most of the area. More and more people are moving in and this request may come up more often than not. **Financial Implications:** 

Signs cost approximately \$400.00 plus staff time for installation.

Re- Proposed posting of 60km/hr. speed limit on Lynch Rd. and Colton Rd.

I would like to formally request the Township implement a posted 60km/hr. speed limit on Lynch Road and Colton Road. The area to be from Stone Road to McCuaig. I would like to make reference to safety concerns including lack of visibility due to steep hills, excessive speed of vehicles, past accidents including one near fatal in which I was a witness, as well as numerous "close calls." The main concern of this area is the many steep hills. Upon ascending, a driver in access of 60km/hr. does not have enough time to react to a vehicle, pedestrian or animal on the other side of the crest of the hill.

I would like you to examine the attached petition which shows the support of the residents in the affected area. This section of roadway has 13 occupied residences. Upon examination of the petition you will see that 10 of the 13 residences support this cause. That is a whopping 77% of residence approval. I am sure with this high level of support you will have no problem in implementing this request.

Upon canvassing for this petition I had overwhelming support with many comments and stories from residents. These included "my children are not allowed to bike or walk on this road," "I cannot take my horses on the road," "I fear for my pets," as well as every single person citing many "near misses." I hope that you can come to the decision to support this initiative as well. Let's make this neighborhood a safe place to be enjoyed by all.

Re: McMahon Road Culvert

#### **Background:**

On April 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2023, Staff received information that there was the start of a possible culvert failure on McMahon Road. Upon inspection staff determined that a portion of the culvert has separated close to the shoulder of the road and that the bottom of the culvert has deteriorated. In 1987 this road was reconstructed due to a failing Bridge that was located near the Campbells Sawmill. Approximately 100m Southeast off Ferguslea Road. At this time there was a 3.1M by 28M culvert installed. This culvert accepts water shed mainly from Reid's Lake plus drainage from the South towards the K+P corridor. There are large amounts of water during the spring run off which deems for this size of culvert.

#### Discussion:

On April 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2023, Staff received information that there was the start of a possible culvert failure on McMahon Road. Upon inspection staff determined that a portion of the culvert has separated close to the shoulder of the road and that the bottom of the culvert has deteriorated. In 1987 this road was reconstructed due to a failing Bridge that was located near the Campbells Sawmill. Approximately 100m Southeast off Ferguslea Road. At this time there was a 3.1M by 28M culvert installed. This culvert accepts water shed mainly from Reid's Lake plus drainage from the South towards the K+P corridor. There are large amounts of water during the spring run off which deems for this size of culvert.

The County of Renfrew passed a By-Law to accept all bridges and culverts that were more than 3M in diameter from lower tier Municipalities. During this process it has come to our attention that this culvert was missed or overlooked. Following the same water shed which is known as McGee's Creek the next down stream culvert that crosses

Ferguslea Road is approximately the same size and has been adopted by the County of Renfrew.

This failing culvert comes with many concerns. McMahon Road is a dead-end road that services approximately 25 year-round residents as well as the former Reid's Lake Campground which currently has approximately 100 sites according to their map.

In 2019 the Municipality found themselves in a similar situation. On the Culhane Rd there was a major culvert failure. This situation, although this culvert was determined to be only a 2.5M was owned by the Municipality. There were larger size culverts both up and down stream from this location owned by the County of Renfrew. This failed culvert was reconstructed by the Municipality with a larger size multi-Plate culvert and then adopted by the County of Renfrew.

#### **Financial Implications:**

There would be many different options to consider for the replacement of this culvert. These could consist of replacement with the same style of culvert (pre-formed with couplers), Multi Plate (steel) culvert or possible Box Culvert (cement).

In 2019 the approximate cost for the replacement of the Culhane Culvert was \$340,000 for a Muti-Plate culvert. Keeping in mind this portion of the road was able to be closed to all traffic. This would not be the situation with McMahon Road which would create higher costs.

#### **Recommendation for Council:**

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Township of Admaston/Bromley Committee recommends to Council to request the County of Renfrew to review the McMahon Road Culvert as it meets the requirements of the County of Renfrew Policy – Bridge Design and Construction and should have been adopted into the County's jurisdiction;

**AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT** the McMahon Road Culvert is also an emergency repair at this time as per the County of Renfrew policy.
